4-H Youth Compete in Goat Show

This January, a VIP delegation led by board member Ken Schumann helped facilitate a goat competition for 4-H youth. Approximately 15 members of the Mirebalais club gathered with their goats for a unique learning experience. The goats were divided into categories by age and sex. They were judged on their conformation by Gerry Schumann, who has many years of goat judging experience in the US. Goats and handlers were awarded ribbons for first, second, and third place in each division, and the overall male and female winners received a trophy. The event, which was the first of its kind for our 4-H clubs, was deemed a success by all!



2019 VIP Cultural Trip



The VIP Cultural Trip to Haiti far exceeded our expectations and even our imagination. Six talented, generous and adventurous travelers accompanied LouAnn and I to Port-au-Prince and Mirebalais to experience the sights, sounds and tastes of a new culture. While meeting the people and interacting with the children, the poverty of Haiti disappears. We saw the energy and joy in the Haitian faces as we listened to their stories, held their hands, and allowed them to touch our hair and sit on our laps (for children only).

With more people than a transportation system can handle, we traveled around Port-au-Prince. Our first stop was the Red

Cross construction site of a new blood bank. The six million dollar building was carefully planned for the ease of donating blood and the security of the plasma. The construction will be finished in May 2019. We also caught a glimpse of Haitian history at the National Museum. On Sunday we joined Haitians in a Bible study and worship service. Although we didn't understand the Creole, we realized through their translated greeting that our presence was a blessing. They asked us to be their ambassadors to spread the word that we are welcome in Haiti. With a stop in Croix des Bouquets we saw and heard how the sheets of metal are skillfully pounded into works of art. With a little bit of bargaining all of us had souvenirs to remind us of the sunny days in Haiti.

After crossing the mountains we saw and heard the excitement of Mirebalais. Sunday afternoon we were entertained by 4-H youth from three different clubs with songs, skits, and dances. In the following afternoons we met 30 students for two hours each day to enrich their English language skills. Songs and games were a big hit as well as learning numbers. The finale was an afternoon with a prize filled BINGO game! In the mornings we toured the local market, took a boat ride along the Artibonite River, toured the Mirebalais Hospital, visited schools, took a walk over the dam, cooled off in the waterfall and visited an orphanage. Some of the participants choose to get a glimpse of another VIP project by spending the day distributing water filters.



To be on the safe side when we learned that the roads to Mirebalais would be blocked, we added an extra day in Port-au-Prince. That was a day of relaxation, fun in the pool and some additional shopping. We were all happy that our flexible schedule worked out so well. Our future cultural trips will be referred to as adventures since we all agreed that nine days in Haiti is an ADVENTURE! Planning ahead for 2020? You'll have a choice of dates—either Friday, January 10 to Saturday, January 18 or Saturday, January 18 to Sunday, January 26.
